These symptoms will affect the safety, heat retention and beauty of your cover.  Dry Brittle Dirty  FOAM CORES Foam cores are critical to heat retention and safety. Cores can be replaced, but for covers over two years old, core replacement is not recommended.  Torn  HINGE Precious heat can escape if a hinge tear goes beyond the Heat Seal Shoe (approx. 2" from the outside edge).
